SECRETARY'S REPORT

2010 was a successful year for the branch. The paid up membership was 158 with 31 new members. There was very good attendance at the regular monthly meetings.

As usual a large congregation attended the Annual Memorial Mass in October. In-spite of the very inclement weather on the day, the Annual Christmas Lunch was well supported. The social committee was very busy organising visits to the Ulster Transport Museum and to the Limerick/Shannon region. In Limerick a wreath was laid at the memorial on the Dublin road where four air corps personnel died in a road accident in 1940. A wreath was laid at the crash site where Air Corps Pilots and two ATC Shannon Personnel died in a crash of a DH Dove Aircraft near Newmarket on Fergus.

On the same trip a visit was made to the Flying-Boat Museum in Foynes and to the Atlantic Airventure Centre in Shannon which is owned and operated by branch member Eddie Ryan.

For the first time the Branch took part in outdoor collections as part of the ONET Fuchsia campaign. There is a significant improvement in the Memorial Garden in Baldonnel which enhances the monument.

With the help of individuals and class groups the link and the website continue to keep members informed of the activities of the branch. We hope to have another successful year in 2011.

Profile of John Patterson

John W. Patterson is a very dedicated and committed member of the Branch.

He has led an exciting life of which over 40 years were served in the Aviation Industry. John hails from Carrowlustia, Calry in County Sligo.

He received his early schooling in Bulinorley National School and in the Sligo

Technical Institute. Before he embarked on his Aviation career, John was a jockey for a while training show jumpers in Sligo.

In 1950 he enlisted as an Apprentice in the Air Corps.

Having completed his Air Corps service in 1959, John joined Morton Air Services in Croyden and was assigned to the Far East

and Middle East where he spent five varied and exciting years as Chief Engineer with Burma Shell.

During this period he survived a devastating cyclone in Pakistan and a military take-over in Burma. John was selected to play for the Pakistan rugby team in a match against India in Calcutta but because of the deteriorating relationship between the two countries, Burma Shell would not allow John to travel to the match.

During his period as Chief Engineer with Shell the Chief Pilot at the time was Douglas Bader the renowned legless pilot of WW2 fame. In Saudia Arabia he had the distinction of being invited to a private dinner with the King.

Romance was in the air too as John at one time did "a line" with U Thants's (Gen Sec U.N.) daughter for a while. In 1964 John returned to Ireland to take up employment with Aer Lingus.

He retired in 1993.He had the distinction of holding an AME Licence on the Trident autoland system and also held a licence on the Concorde. He was awarded a special overall licence on all aircraft by the Royal Aeronautical Society.

John is married to Adeline (Addie) a highly respected Lay Minister in the Church of Ireland community in the Swords/ Donabate area. They have three in family, two daughters and a son.

In retirement John enjoys his nine motorcycles, four of which are taxed and operational.

Late Ken Lougheed

All Branch Members were saddened by the recent passing of our colleague Ken Lougheed on 15th February, 2011.

Ken was born in Kent and moved to Kells Co. Meath when his father was appointed Sexton in the local Church of Ireland. He attended the Carrick Primary school and the Kells Technical Institute. Ken joined the Air Corps as an Apprentice in 1946.

He was prominent as a Gaelic Footballer in his late teens and one of his claims to fame was that he was the first Englishman to win a championship medal playing with Dublin Minors in 1948.

Most of his time in the Air Corps was served in Gormanston. He retired as a Flight Sgt after 26 service .He later was employed as Security Manager in the Butlins Holiday Camp in Mosney.

Ken was a PC in the East Meath region and was fully committed to serving the local community. This was reflected by the overflow congregation at his funeral service. Members of the Roger Casement Branch joined with members of the Slane Branch ONET in providing a Guard of Honour. Serving Air Corps members acted as pallbearers. A piper from the Roger Casement Branch rendered appropriate honours. Ken was an active and dedicated member of ONET.

Air Corps News

BRIGIDIR GENERAL PAUL FRY GENERAL OFFICER COMMANDING IRISH AIR CORPS.

On Jan 13th 2011, Brig Gen Paul Fry was appointed General Officer Commanding the Irish Air Corps. He takes up the appointment vacated by Major General Ralph James on his promotion to the Deputy Chief of Staff (Operations) of the Irish Defence Forces.

Born in Dublin in 1956 Brig Gen. Fry was educated in Sutton Park School, Howth, Co. Dublin and was awarded an Air Corps Cadetship in 1974. He commenced Officer Cadet training with the 51st Army Cadet Class that year and was awarded his "Wings" and commissioned as a Pilot Officer in 1976; his Air Corps Cadet Class – the 9th Regular Air Corps Cadet Class – being the first to graduate on the then new twin-jet trainer, the CM 170 Super Magister.

Brig Gen Fry has over 5000 flying hour's flight experience, this experience being split equally between helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft. He has displayed the Gazelle, Alouette 3 and Marchetti SF260WE aircraft at many national and international air shows and is currently rated on the PC9M turbo-prop training aircraft. He qualified for the award of his parachutists "Wings" having completed the Military Parachute Training Course in September 2001 and has completed over 20 jumps.

Overseas service brought Brig Gen Fry to the Western Sahara, seeing service as a Military Observer with the United Nations Observer Mission "MINURSO" from Oct 1995 to April 1996.

Brig Gen Fry is married to Gillian, a pharmacist, and has three children, Andrew (a qualified Air Corps pilot flying AW139's and EC135's in No.3 Operations Wing in the Air Corps) David (a computer consultant) and Claire (a nurse). He lives in Firhouse, Co. Dublin. His interests include volleyball, running, golf, target shooting, scuba diving, cricket and fishing.



10,000Hrs of PC9M flight.
