Roger Casement Branch wins the Best Branch Award

The Roger Casement Branch was awarded the perpetual trophy for Best Branch by ONET CEO Ollie O'Connor at the company AGM which was held in Wexford on 8/9 June 2013.

It is the first occasion for the Branch to receive this coveted trophy in its thirty four year old history.

The Roger Casement Branch which is predominately comprised of retired Air Corps members is the largest branch in the ONE network with in excess of 150 paid-up members.

Since 2007, the Branch has set up a website and social network systems and produces a quarterly newsletter The Link which is circulated to the members. This newsletter which provides updated details of former members also provides details of present developments in the Air Corps and is seen on the website by many hundreds of former Air Corps personnel. It is significant that every edition of the Newsletter has been sponsored by former Air Corps classes or individuals or by aviation related organisations.

The Branch also makes a substantial annual donation from its fund raising projects to ONET in support of the hostels for homeless for needy former members of the Defence Forces.

A member of the Branch, Jim Nolan, also served as National President of ONET.

The Branch holds its monthly meeting in Casement Aerodrome and appreciates the great support and encouragement given by successive Air Corps GOC's and serving Air Corps members. Members of the Branch pay an active part in the maintenance and care of the Air Corps museum.

The present award recognises the contribution that the Branch has made in support of ONET's objectives but also pays tribute to the pioneering founder members of the Branch and the successive Chairmen and members who have developed the Branch to its present status as 'Branch of the Year'

Branch History

In late 1979 it was decided to form a Branch of the O.N.E. which would have close links with the Air Corps and have Baldonnel as its base. In this way, the Branch through the ONE organisation would provide help and assistance where necessary to camp personnel at the time of their discharge.

With the kind permission of the GOC Air Corps, the Branch was named "The Roger Casement Branch" and was permitted to hold their meetings in Casement Aerodrome. From that meagre beginning, the Branch has grown from strength to strength and is now held in high regard within the O.N.E. organisation.

The success of the Branch stems primarily from the support and activities of the members and with the help and co-operation from GOC Air Corps and the personnel in Casement Aerodrome.

Apart from keeping to the mission of maintaining contact with former colleagues, a number of significant events have been undertaken by the Roger Casement Branch including:

- The creation of the O.N.E. Memorial Garden in Casement Aerodrome with the unique Monument to the memory of deceased former Air Corps members.
- An Annual Mass of Commemoration which is held in October each year in the Garrison Church in Casement Aerodrome.
- A Memorial Book containing the inscribed names of the deceased personnel is located in a special cabinet in the church.
- The presentation of a unit flag designed by a member of the Branch to the Apprentice Training School.
- A presentation to the GOC Air Corps of a book of copies of the letters of Roger Casement.

The GOC Air Corps allocated an office in the Museum area for use by the Branch. Each year a number of trips to places of historical interest are arranged as well as events which provide an opportunity for former colleagues to meet and renew acquaintances, for example, the annual lunch at Christmas creates an opportunity for retired personnel who have previously served in the Air Corps to socialise and renew acquaintances with each other. This is a very popular event and has become a favourite reunion of former colleagues.

The highlight of the year is the Annual Memorial Mass which is held in the Garrison Church in Casement Aerodrome on the second Sunday of October.

Deceased former Air Corps members are remembered at the Mass and a wreath is laid at the adjoining memorial monument. The church is normally filled to capacity with former Air Corps personnel and families of deceased members.

Personnel who have served in any part of the Defence Forces are very welcome to join the Roger Casement Branch and to attend the Branch Meeting which is held on the third Thursday of each month at 20.00 hours in the NCO's Mess, Casement Aerodrome.

Newcastle Community Kicentenary Celebrations

On Sunday the 16/June/2013 Newcastle Parish Community, Co Dublin, held a special Mass, and monument unveiling ceremony to celebrate the bicentenary of the building of St Finian's church in the village. This beautiful Gothic style church was built in 1813, 16 years before the Catholic Relief Act was passed in the House of Commons, which granted Catholic emancipation in Britain and Ireland.

The Chief Celebrant was Most Rev. Diarmuid Martin Archbishop of Dublin assisted by Most Rev. Eamonn Walsh, Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin, Very Rev. Enda Cunningham P.P. Newcastle, and priests from the local villages of Rathcoole, Saggart, and Lucan.

The Roger Casement Branch was invited to take part in the ceremonies and provide a Colour Party and Honour Guard at the Mass and also to provide a Colour Party and Guard of Honour for the unveiling of the bicentenary granite monument in the church grounds. We had a turnout of 14 branch members with invited guests Mr Ollie O'Connor CEO ONET, and Mr Isadore Fleming, former president of the Leinster Area Council ONET, also in attendance.

After the monument unveiling ceremony, the Archbishop took time to meet all the members of the Guard of Honour.

It was a great honour for our branch to take part in a Baldonnel neighbourhood community celebration and we are grateful to the Newcastle Parish Committee for their kind invitation and for the great reception we received. I would like to thank our long standing branch member and former ONET National President, Mr Jim Nolan, who resides in Newcastle, for coordinating all the protocols with the parish committee and with the Mass celebrants, to allow for the branch's participation. It was a very memorable day for the Roger Casement Branch.




BUSY TIME FOR HELICOPTER WING

Over the last few days the Helicopter Wing has been busy providing support for the G8 summit; parachuting over the Curragh Camp; conducting training with the Survival, Evasion, Resistance, and Escape (SERE) Course and Army Sniper Instructor Course; and assisting with the LE Roisin during its ship readiness exercises off the coast of Cork.

On June 19th, while refuelling at Cork airport during a training exercise with the Naval service, AW277 was re-tasked and subsequently completed a time critical Air Ambulance from Cork Airport to the Phoenix Park. The crew met with the patient and arrived in Dublin 50 minutes later.
