## FROM THE CHAIRMAN..

A group of fourteen Branch Members had an early start on August 25 for a two day visit to the historic sites of the War of Independence and Civil War.

This was an intense and wide ranging tour to the many places of historic interest.

Day 1 included visits to Collins Barracks Museum in Cork City, then on to the site of the Crossbarry ambush. Lunch was had at the Munster Arms Hotel in Bandon which was known as Lee's Hotel at the time and where

Michael Collins spent his last night before the fatal ambush at Beal na Blath.

In the afternoon the Branch Chairman laid a wreath on behalf of the Branch at the Memorial Monument at Beal na Blath. The tour continued to Kilmichael to the site of the ambush in 1920 and then on to the birthplace of Sam Maguire.

On day 2 after a very pleasant stay in the Dunmore House Hotel overlooking Clonakilty Bay, the tour continued, taking in Woodfield,

The team which was managed and selected




by Tim Malone was comprised of Bill O'Neill (captain), Brendan Barden, Paddy Donnelly and Sean Whelan.

# COMMEMORATION CEREMONIES AT FLANDERS AND THE SOMME

Two members of the Roger Casement Branch had the honour of attending the memorial ceremonies at the World War One battlefields in Belgium and France on July 1, 2009.

Tony Roe and Branch Chairman Paddy O'Meara joined up with a group of O.N.E. Members from Cork led by Jerry Conroy and participated in four wreath laying ceremonies. They also visited a number of cemeteries in the Ypres Salient and at the British Front at the Somme. A visit to the impressive Irish Peace Park was also included. The visit coincided with the annual July 1st commemoration ceremonies.

On 1 July 1916, at precisely 7.30 am, after the simultaneous explosion of several huge mines, and moving close behind the barrage of the allied artillery, the British and French infantry advanced from their trenches.

The number of casualties suffered on that single tragic day was 58,000 including some 20,000 killed.

Little mention has been made of the tens of thousands of young Irishmen who fought and died particularly during the summer of 1916.

Irishmen served in the 16TH (Irish) Division and in the 36th (Ulster) Division which was mainly comprised of Unionists. Irish Regiments included the Munster and Dublin Fusiliers, the Leinster Regiment, Connaught Rangers, Inniskilling Fusiliers and the Royal Irish Regiment.

It is also evident by reference to the names of dead soldiers on various monuments, that large numbers of Irishmen also served with various commonwealth armies particularly from Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

In recent years, progress has been made in remembering and honouring our fellow countrymen who took part in the conflict when, with the support of the Irish

Government the Irish Peace Park near Ypres was created.

It was also significant that a serving Irish Brig-General in uniform represented the Government at the various memorial services in France.

The Roger Casement Branch was represented at the wreath laying ceremony at the Somme Memorial ceremony in Thiepval. The Chairman later took part in a historic ceremony at the Ulster Memorial Tower when wreaths were laid jointly with retired members of the Royal Irish Regiment to honour deceased members of the 36th (Ulster) Division.

A further wreath was laid at the 16th (Irish) Division Memorial in Guillemont. We also had the opportunity of participating in wreath laying ceremonies at the Menin Gate in Ypres.

During the visit to the Thiepval Memorial, Tony located the inscribed names of two uncles of Branch member Frank Donnelly. It is ironic that both the brothers from Dublin were killed on the same day, September 9th, 1916.

Access to the Somme area is now relatively easy from Ireland with daily flights to Beauvais from Dublin and Shannon. A visit to this historic area should be a must for all Irish people where fellow countrymen from every corner of Ireland, many of whom still in their teens, made the ultimate sacrifice in the name of Freedom.

## FLYING FILMS MEMORIAL WINDOW

Following the successful Flying Films reunion in September 2008, it was decided to install a memorial stained glass window in the station church in Baldonnel as a permanent commemoration of the historic film period. It was also decided to add a memorial plaque to remember those who died during the filming operations.

The window was financed by donations received from former Air Corps personnel many of whom had participated in the filming activities.

The dedication ceremony was carried out by the station chaplain Fr Gerry Carroll on July 22, 2009. Approximately 50 guests were in attendance including members of the Liddy

and Boddington families. Brig-Gen Ralph James and Col Paul Fry were also present.

The window was designed and manufactured by Alan Tomlin of Irish Stained Glass Windows Ltd.

The committee Chairman, Paddy O'Meara in welcoming the guests expressed his gratitude for the kind donations received and to the members of the committee for their support and dedication in organising the reunion and for the completion of the window project. Special thanks to Geoffrey O'Byrne-White CEO of CityJet and Louise McEnerney for their generous support and assistance. Guests were entertained in the Officers Mess after the dedication ceremony.

A new Website has been launched by The Roger Casement Branch.

The website will be particularly interesting to former Air Corps members who are based overseas and it is hoped that the membership will increase as a result of this new development.


